### Respect All Life: Our Virtue of the Week

**Respect All Life** is to regard highly and to hold as sacred life in all forms from conception to natural death.

#### Scripture Reference

John 10:10 – I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.

Because God created us in his image and likeness, we reflect His love and eternal goodness. The value and worth we share because of this is our human dignity. Catholic Social Teaching calls upon us to respect this inherent dignity through a defense of and reverence for all life. The Fifth Commandment states succinctly, "You shall not kill." This most basic of human rights not only calls upon us to refrain from the taking of another human life, but also to holding the lives of others – particularly those who are innocent and cannot defend themselves – as sacred. Saint John Paul II described the sanctity of human life in this way. "The human person is a unique composite – a unity of spirit and matter, soul and body, fashioned in the image of God and destined to live forever. Every human life is sacred, because every human person is sacred." Thus we look at life, from the wonder of the child being formed in his or her mother's womb to the person passing from this life in death as a great gift from God, creator of us all.

Pope Francis said this about the Church's consistent life ethic, "All life has inestimable value even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect."

As our Popes indicated, part of a respect for life is valuing of each human person, including ourselves, as one made in the image and likeness of God. What does this mean for you? How do you live each day with a respect for all life? What might you do today to put this belief into action?

#### Respect Life in Action:

Teaching respect for all life begins with teaching children about the dignity of all human persons and — as we reflect on last week's Feast of St. Francis — all living things. As a Catholic school, a respect for life and the dignity of the human person is a central theme of our religion curriculum for all grades. It is this very respect for the life and dignity of each individual that encourages our teachers and students to foster respectful behavior in our school.

#### Student Progress Reporting

The last few years, progress reports have been sent out to families every three weeks by e-mail. With our new progress reporting system, that is no longer necessary as parents can check their student's progress online through Beehively at any time. Here is how you can check your student's grades:

- 1) Log onto the Beehively site. This can be done directly from our new website (<http://olaparishschool.beehv.com/>) or you can log on by going to <https://olaparishschool.beehively.com>.
- 2) Click on the Classroom/Groups button at the top of the page.
- 3) Select your child's class and teacher.
- 4) Once on the teacher's page, select "grades" on the menu to the left, and that will take you to your child's current progress report.

We are asking parents to check their child's progress regularly so that there are no surprises when report cards come out. If you have questions about your child's progress, please contact the teacher.


