At our first school Liturgy on Friday, I asked our students to close their eyes and imagine a mosaic painting or the picture of George Washington on the dollar bill. I explained to them that these pictures are made of up of small dots that individually are simple and plain, but that collectively form a beautiful and complex picture. That is how the Virtues work within us. With the help of God's grace, they form something very special: our character. William Bennett, who authored <u>The Book of Virtues</u>, wrote in its introduction that in order for the virtues to take root, they must be practiced. "Like anything else worthwhile," he says, "attaining virtue requires serious effort and attention. You must set some standards for yourself and then do everything you can to live up to them in your everyday activities...When the virtues are a matter of habit for you, you're well equipped to face life." With intention and focus, our students will explore these 52 virtues and values this year and discover how they fit into our faith and our own lives.

Our Lady of the Assumption Extension Program Information

Our Lady of Assumption Extension Program offers a Kindergarten Enrichment Program (KinderRich), as well as before and after school care for OLA students. We strive to give your student a sense of their own worth and specialness in all aspects of living and learning.

Extension operates in accordance with the philosophy and value systems of OLA School. We offer your student a variety of experiences and activities within a Catholic environment. Recreation, enrichment, study, rest, and relaxation are part of each day. All children in grades one through eight attend study hall after having a nutritious snack. Our study hall program is supervised by trained and certified educators.

We open at 7:00 a.m. for students who are enrolled in Extension and have paid the morning care fee. The doors do not open before 7:00 a.m., even if a staff person is inside. Students get signed in and then have free play time or may study on their own (no homework assistance is provided at this time do to staff/student ratio). All children must stay inside the Extension building until the school campus opens at 7:30 a.m., and they can stay no later than 7:45 a.m. unless they are attending our morning KinderRich session which starts at 8 a.m. Students walk as a group over to the main gate and are guided by school staff, to ensure their safety. There is no breakfast provided, but students may bring their own meals or snacks as long as they are in-line with our school's food allergy policy.

We have a program from 8:00 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. that we call KinderRich. Morning KinderRich students may arrive no earlier than

7:45 a.m., unless they are enrolled in our morning care program. Failure to comply will result in a warning, and after that there will be a charge for morning care. KinderRich is for our Kindergarten children during the time they are not in class. KinderRich is covered by your school tuition; however, there is a registration fee that helps us stock up on those materials that boost our art, science, and outdoor activities. We have planned activities, story time, outdoor time, rest time, and free play. Free play is a crucial part of socialization, which is an important part of functioning well at school.

AFTER SCHOOL INFORMATION

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES: We are required by law to have each child signed out. Please come in and sign your student out when you pick them up. This is also how we account for billable time; if student is not signed out you will be billed for a full day of care. Once students are signed out or leave Extension to participate in an on-campus activity, they may not return to Extension unless prior arrangements have been made and were approved by the Director.

CELL PHONES: We would like parents to leave their cell phones in the car when they come in to pick up their children. I know everyone is very busy these days and there never seems to be enough time in the day to get everything done, but your children need your full attention when you come in to get them. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. Please remember that your children are not to have cell phones at Extension. They may not pull them out of their backpacks to check messages etc. If you need to reach your child, you may always call here. We always allow the children to call their parents when there is a need. If you do not want your child calling you after school, please let your child and us know.

REGISTRATION FORM: This form (separate from the school registration form) must be filled out completely and returned in order for your student to use Extension services. This form can be found and completed on our school Web site.

BEHAVIOR: It is important that parents and children all understand the rules at Extension. Extension must follow all guidelines included in the school handbook. Below, you will find a list of specific Extension rules and the study hall procedures. Please review these papers with your children. If you have a question about any of these, please feel free to speak with me. Please remind your children that profanity of any kind will not be tolerated. If a child is using profanity, he/she will be suspended from extension for at least one day. Excessive cruelty or unmerciful teasing will also be grounds for suspension. Our program is based on Christian values, and we want to encourage this with the children. Children are expected to treat staff and one another with Christian respect.

Behavior Policies

The following procedures will be followed if an act of discipline is required:

- 1. Reprimand (verbal warning).
- 2. Time out to observe appropriate behavior and think about actions.
- 3. Change of stations, possible suspension from stations for a day or week, and discussion with parents.
- 4. If problem persists, the parent/guardian will be called and expected to pick up the child, possible suspension from the program.
- 5. Termination from the program.

We also adhere to all the school rules and parent handbook.

HOMEWORK/STUDY HALL: Students will be asked to show our Study Hall Supervisor their homework assignment notebook with all their homework written in it when they check in. Before leaving study hall, they must show their finished work to the Study Hall Supervisor. Parents will be notified if their child/children have a behavior problem or do not come to study hall with all their work and supplies. Children are required to do all written assignments before they go out to play. They are welcome to stay and study quietly until 5:00, when we close study hall. In addition, your child must have written permission to skip homework time. Please remember it is up to you to check your child/children's homework each night. Our study hall supervisors are there to help when asked, but they are not personal tutors. They will quickly check homework to see if it is complete, and if they see a mistake, they will have the child correct it. However, not every problem or sentence will be checked. Please review your child's homework once you get home.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS: Fees for the Extension Program are based on the actual cost of operating the program. You will be billed for time used in the first week of the following month; all payments are to be received no later than the due date on the invoice. There will be a service fee on all returned checks. Two returned checks will result in the acceptance of cash or money order payments only for all future fees. You received a rate sheet with your registration form. You may refer to that for your fee amounts. Your child's attendance should match the fees paid. THERE IS A \$20 LATE FEE FOR OVERDUE INVOICES. This must be enforced to keep our prices low for all Extension families.

A FEW NOTES AND REMINDERS:

1. Be sure your children have their names on everything: backpacks, books, lunches, and all clothing including socks and underwear.

2. Please be sure to send a lunch on all minimum days. Include a drink in their lunch because we do not have milk. Please do not send anything that requires preparation.

3. Keeping our balls is always a problem. The children will kick them over the fence or up on the roof. We are not allowed to go up on the roof to get them. It is often months before we see those balls again. The following rules will apply:

4. Older children, who leave the school grounds using their walking pass, may not return to Extension without prior arrangements between the Director and parents.

Students who are left past 3:15 PM more than once time during the school year must be registered and will be billed for registration fee and time used. Monthly Rates are for time used between 7-7:45 AM & 3-6:30 PM and billing for the month goes out the first week of the following month. Total days in between the scale will be billed at the higher rate. Late fees are applied for no payment by due date, failure to pay for services can also result in a suspension or termination of Extension services.
