## With Hands to Serve and Hearts to Love

### Honor: Our Virtue of the Week

**Honor** is honesty, fairness, or integrity in one's beliefs and actions. It is also the recognition of human dignity we offer by showing respect for other people, their names and reputations.

#### Scripture Reference

Romans 12:10...*love one another with mutual affection; anticipate one another in showing honor.*

"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but names will never hurt me." If ever there was a ridiculous platitude, this must be it. Anyone who has been the victim of gossip, slander or name calling knows the power of the tongue to wound. In one of his reflections, Pope Francis spoke about the destructive effects of hurtful talk. "Gossip can also kill, because it kills the reputation of the person! It is so terrible to gossip! At first it may seem like a nice thing, even amusing, like enjoying a candy. But in the end, it fills the heart with bitterness, and even poisons us." (Angelus, February 16, 2014)

The Eighth Commandment calls us to the truth. By not "bearing false witness," we mind what we say as much as what we do. Our Catholic faith teaches us to honor the dignity of each person. One of the most vital ways to do so is by safeguarding another's reputation and good name as carefully as we would do our own. It not only spares us the "bitter heart," but also makes honorable our words, deeds, and intentions.

It can be a challenge to counter gossip or other forms of slanderous talk. How might you check a negative conversation by turning it towards something loving and honorable?

Honor requires self-sacrifice and the discipline to counter our innate impulses and our visceral feelings. I had a sensei who modeled these traits, and I often thought of him when discerning a difficult decision or reacting to a heated situation. "How would Hirayama Sensei respond?" I would ask myself. The saints and the role models in our lives today are like the stars that illuminate the dark skies at night. If we look to them as inspiring examples, they can help us to become more honorable people.

#### Honor in Action:

Cyber-bullying is one of the most destructive and worrisome forms of slander, particularly among young people. Discuss with your children strategies for countering its pervasive use through the cultivation of behavior honoring each student's dignity.

#### Lice Lessons

Last week, we discovered lice on campus. As we did last year, we had all of our students checked for lice, and several of our students were found to have lice or nits. A lice infestation can happen to anyone, and it's no one's fault. Lice do not cause serious illness or bodily harm. They are most often attached to clean heads, and they spread most often from head-to-head contact. So, if a student has lice, we ask him or her to be a friend and tell a friend. These way friends can get checked.

Again, if you find head lice, there are four critical steps in their treatment:

1. Nit removal from the head by combing with a special comb is the most important lice control measure. Complete nit removal is time consuming but it is critical for successful treatment.
2. Use of an effective head louse treatment.
3. Removal of all lice and nits from the environment by washing and, more importantly, drying. There is no need to spray pesticides at home.
4. Daily head check and nit removal until they are gone followed by weekly head checks to detect re-infestation.

Per our policy, students who have been infected will be required to show proof of treatment when returning to school.

We had a Certified Lice Specialist from Levia Health on campus last week administering the checks. Levia provides lice removal services for families in need. Another service that many of our families have used is the Sacramento Lice Removal Service. Both services have been highly recommended by people at OLA. # The Facts of LICE

## WHAT ARE HEAD LICE?

Head lice, scientifically known as *Pediculus Capitis*, are sesame seed sized insects that live only in the hair of a human head. Their oval shaped eggs (nits) are slightly smaller than the size of a poppy seed.

Up to 12 million kids in the U.S. alone get head lice every year, making them one of the main causes of missed school days.

Head lice are up to 4 times more likely to be found on girls than boys due to hair length and head-to-head contact. Lice are typically darker in color, making them more difficult to spot in dark colored hair.

Lice have six legs that have claws at the end of them; they use these claws for clasping onto hair strands and for maneuvering between them. This is their only form of movement as lice are incapable of flying or jumping.

### What is the head lice cycle?

Head lice live for approximately 30 days and will typically spend their entire lives on a human head. The lice life cycle can be split into 3 stages:

**1) Nit (Egg) Stage:** a female louse lays up to 6 eggs every day from the moment she becomes an adult, totaling up to 140 eggs per female louse over her lifetime. When eggs are laid, the female secretes a glue-like substance that binds the oval shaped egg onto the hair shaft near the scalp on an angle, a strong bond that makes them difficult to pull off.

**2) Nymph stage:** once hatched, the nymph stage lasts 7-10 days before they reach adult size. During the nymph stage they cannot reproduce. Nymphs are extremely small, making them very difficult to spot, and therefore causing lots of problems for people trying to break the lice cycle.

**3) Adult Stage:** the adult stage typically lasts 20-23 days. There are usually a higher proportion of adult egg-laying females than males.



### Are head lice dangerous?

Head lice cannot transfer disease (as opposed to body lice) and are not dangerous. Very few people have more than a mild reaction, although secondary infections can occur due to open wounds from scratching.

### How are head lice transferred?

The most common way of transferring head lice is via head-to-head contact. Head lice can also be transferred by sharing inanimate objects (hats, clothes, brushes, pillows, etc); this is uncommon as head lice will not leave someone's head for an inanimate object unless they are either repelled or fall off someone's head (due to brushing or other action).

Adult lice need to find their way back to the head within 24 hours to survive. Household pets do not transfer lice.

If any eggs somehow fall off the head, the likelihood of them hatching is extremely small. Even if any manage to hatch, they will not be able to survive without feeding immediately, so there is no real concern for infestations caused by eggs found off the head.

Some people believe that they have been re-infested with lice due to contact with inanimate objects. In the vast majority of the situations this is not the case; the person was most likely re-infested via head-to-head contact, or most likely never fully eradicated them from their head in the first place. Just a few missed head lice or nits on the head are all that are needed to restart a lice infestation.

Lice are not killed in the pool, but they also cannot be transferred by "swimming" to other heads.

### Do lice prefer clean or dirty hair?

It is likely that they prefer cleaner hair as the cleaner environment is more comfortable for them and it is easier for them to grasp onto clean hair rather than oily hair. It is important that kids understand this as it can affect their self-esteem!

### Are people of African-American heritage less likely to get them?

Some studies indicate that lice infestations in African-Americans are as low as 0.5% of the population compared to their European-American counterparts (approximately 10%).

### Did you know?

Head lice are capable of feeding off any blood type once they hatch from their eggs, but the first blood type they feed off of will determine their feeding blood type for the rest of their lives; if they switch to a different blood type (or RH), they will die.

They therefore have the ability to "sense" blood types on a host. If there is a mismatch, they will attempt to leave the head to find a suitable candidate, but can lay eggs prior to leaving.

## HEAD LICE & NIT DETECTION

### *How do I know if I have head lice and/or nits?*

Some people feel a few of these symptoms, others feel none of them. Therefore, it is always important to check if someone was in close contact with a person who was infested even if no symptoms are present.

- Itchy scalp (and sometimes red sores from itching)
- Feeling something moving or tickling on your head
- Feeling irritable
- Difficulty sleeping (lice don't like light and are therefore most active at night or in the dark)

### *How do I check for lice and nits, and what do they look like?*

It is much easier to check for lice when using a strong source of light, whether it be natural or artificial. This is especially the case with live nits since they can appear shiny in the light due to their transparent shell, making them easier to spot. A magnifying lens (or magnifying glasses) can also be useful.

Lice can be found in hair anywhere on the head near the scalp, including the nape of the neck and behind the ears.

Nits found more than an inch away from the scalp have most likely hatched or are dead (non-viable eggs).

There is occasional confusion between dandruff, lice and nits, especially when an itchy head is involved. Using a dandruff shampoo suitable for kids and then reexamining should make diagnosis a bit easier:

- Dandruff is very white and of inconsistent shapes, whereas lice and nits are a cream to darker color and of consistent shape.
- Lice will typically be found on the move.
- Nits are found very close to the scalp and are difficult to pull off since they are "glued" to a hair shaft; dandruff can be found anywhere in the hair and is easily removed using fingers.

## HEAD LICE & NIT REMOVAL

### *What are "Super Lice"?*

Head lice infestations are so difficult to get rid of because lice and nits are both resilient and changing. The conventional chemical based pesticide treatments sold at pharmacies (such as Rid & Nix) aren't nearly as effective today as they were previously; many lice have seemed to have developed immunity to them (known as "super lice"). In addition, these chemical pesticides kill a certain percentage of lice but have no effect on their eggs, making it difficult to break the cycle and therefore requiring multiple applications to try to cover all hatched lice as well.

### *How do I get rid of lice and nits?*

Lice can actually "shutdown" at times of distress as a protection mechanism, therefore tricking people into thinking that they are dead, so 100% manual removal is crucial.

There have been many discussions about using home remedies such as petroleum jelly, olive oil, mayonnaise, vinegar, etc to cure head lice yourself at home. There have been no clinical trials proving that these are effective for curing head lice and/or nits.

No singular "perfect" product exists that provides a 100% mortality rate for head lice and nits, including expensive prescription medications, so manual removal is still the most important part of ending head lice infestations.

To manually remove head lice and nits you need a good metal lice comb (the Terminator comb is known to be the most effective), a good light source, time and patience! A lice removal product that loosens a nit's bond to the hair can also be helpful.

## HEAD LICE PREVENTION

### *How do I prevent and reduce chances of contracting head lice?*

Keeping hair neatly tied up helps reduce chances of contracting head lice. A pony tail which is then plaited helps ensure no loose hairs.

To prevent contracting lice during "sleep overs" at friends, kids should be given their own pillow case and told to 'top and tail' (lie in bed with their heads at opposite ends).

Regular hair products, such as hairsprays and gels, or even colored/dyed hair, do not deter head lice.

### *Do I need to check hair daily?*

No, but spending a minute a day checking hair to discover infestations when they just started is much easier to control than a full blown infestation. It is recommended that your child's hair be checked at least weekly.

### *Do items that may have been in contact with lice need cleaning?*

Using a washing machine and dryer is a good way to kill head lice and nits. The dryer is in fact more important than the washing machine, so using only the dryer can be sufficient. Ensure the dryer is set to high heat and is running for at least 20 minutes.

If an item cannot be put in a dryer, it can be dry cleaned or just washed and left to hang dry - as long as it is isolated for 2 days after washing.

You can also seal items for 10 days. Generally, 48 hours should be enough, but 10 days is suggested in case there are nits on the items well (although likelihood of hatching is very small).

A vacuum can be a useful tool – head lice have no hair to grasp onto when off a host's head, so they are easily sucked off any surface.

Freezing an item for a few hours, boiling or soaking in rubbing alcohol will also kill lice and nits.

Items that have not been in contact with someone infested with lice (such as clothes in a wardrobe) do not need to be cleaned.


