With Hands to Serve and Hearts to Love

Love: Our Virtue of the Week

Love is the free self-giving of the heart to God and neighbor. It is the greatest virtue.

Scripture Reference

Luke 10:27 "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

At the end of the film *The Perfect Storm*, one of its tragic heroes, Bobby Shatford, is all alone in a vast ocean amidst gigantic waves. This is the end for Bobby as the fishing boat he was on has already sank, and he is about to meet his maker. As we prepare for the closing credits to roll down the screen, we see Bobby alone in the storm, a tiny speck bobbing in the enormous waves. And we hear in his closing narrative the goodbye words he prays to his wife. In those words of life reflection, he says, "There is only love. Only love." Bobby is on to something, for in the final analysis, the love we share in our relationships are what matters most in our lifetime.

Try an online search for the word "love," and billions of results pop up. Clearly, there is no shortage of references to and fascination with the concept of love. With so much emphasis on love and so many resources to draw upon, what do we as Christians need to know about love? The answer is pretty basic, as we heard in last Sunday's Gospel reading at Church: love God, love one another, love ourselves. This is the "new commandment" Jesus gives (John 13:34), the litmus test of discipleship. The love of God is total - mind, heart, body, and spirit. It entails a lot of "soul work", such as prayer, worship, reflection, and a cultivation of the virtues. It is also intrinsic to the love of neighbor.

As an internet search suggests, there are multiple forms of love, ranging from the devotion of parent to child and vice versa to the beautiful gift of friendship. Marital love forms the basis for understanding the covenant God forms with humans in the Old Testament. It entails long-lasting dedication and commitment, one vacillating between vexation and tenderness as the promises for lifelong love are carried out. What may begin as eros - the passionate, breathless form of love - mellows over time into something deeper and richer. At its fullest, love ripens into agape - perfect love - which brings us into communion with God and with all of God's holy ones.

As St. Paul tells us, "So, faith, hope and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love." (1Corinthians 13:13). As a virtue, love tops the list. From it, all of the other virtues flow. Consider what love means to you. How do you make love of God and others, as well as yourself, the greatest priority in life?

Children thrive on love. When they experience love from their parents, teachers, peers, and the broader community, they learn what it means to be loved by God and to share love with others. This week, around the dinner table or at a family meeting if you have one, discuss the virtue of love and how this greatest of virtues shapes and enriches our lives. When we put our heads on our pillows at night, can we go to sleep knowing that we fully gave our heart to love?

Tuition Collection Changes

The following information was sent out to families yesterday in our e-blast, but I am including here in the bulletin in case it was missed.

Last week we were unable to process payment of tuition from families who pay monthly by ACH. We learned that the software used for this process, contracted through a third party vendor, was destroyed by terminated employees. As soon as we learned this, we contacted the Diocesan finance department. For protective measures, Diocesan counsel is following up with the company. At the recommendation of the diocese we have decided to stop using this ACH service and move to a tuition collection management system.

Most schools in the Diocese now use such a system, and we will be utilizing FACTS Management to manage tuition collections beginning in November or December at the latest. FACTS is a customer friendly system, and they offer families more flexible options in managing their tuition payments. You will be receiving information from FACTS soon, which will enable us to collect tuition payments. There will not be a cost for this service for the current school year; however, next school year (2015-2016) a fee of approximately \$45 will be included in the first month's tuition payment.

Because of this transition, we have not collected tuition in the month of October. You will receive by e-mail an invoice (one per child) next week, and you will have the option of paying October's tuition by check or online via the Intuit Payment Network (IPN), the payment system currently used by our Extension program. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, but please be assured that our transition to FACTS will be smooth and safe.

Getting ready

Clothing

Wear what you feel great in, whether it's casual or formal clothing. Solid colors work best. Avoid busy patterns: they can distract from your face. Some poses are close up, others full length, so plan outfits completely including shoes.

As a general rule, darker clothes are slenderizing. Avoid baggy clothes that might make you look larger than you are. Sleeveless shirts tend to make your arms look fuller. V-necks are always flattering. Wear a dark t-shirt under dark shirts—a white t-shirt under a dark shirt stands out in a portrait.

Hair

Avoid changing your hairstyle or cutting your hair right before your session. Your photographer will help you identify improperly placed hair, but make sure you like the look and let the photographer know your preferences.

Jewelry/Accessories

Wear special hats and/or jewelry: necklaces, rings, bracelets, etc. Mention to the photographer you would like have your jewelry featured in your portrait.

Make-up

Apply make-up as you would normally would for an evening out. Pay special attention to your eyes: the focal point in a portrait. An extra coat of mascara can help bring out your eyes. Bring lipstick and powder for touch-ups.

Glasses

If you wear glasses all the time, you'll want to have them in your portraits. That's the real you!

Complexion

Lifetouch offers portrait retouch that can soften facial lines and correct blemishes and scratches, scars, etc. We can also whiten teeth and eyes.




