RESOLUTION NO. 2019-05

El Dorado County Hazard Mitigation Plan
Annex "E"

WHEREAS, all real property within El Dorado County that is owned, leased and/or occupied by the El Dorado County Office of Education, is at risk from a wide range of natural and manmade hazards such as, but not limited to, wildland fire, flood, propane spills, dam failure and earthquake; and

WHEREAS, El Dorado County Office of Education, pursuant to Section 322, Mitigation Planning of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, enacted by Section 104 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (P.L. 106-390) and the Interim Final Rule published in the Federal Register on February 25, 2002, at 44 CFR Part 201, is required to prepare and adopt a jurisdiction-wide Hazard Mitigation Plan to assist the El Dorado County Office of Education in making decisions for pre-disaster and post-disaster mitigation projects; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, which is intended to protect El Dorado County citizens and their property from the consequences of hazards, and protect life, safety and property by reducing the potential for future damages and economic losses that result from natural hazards, has been amended to include the El Dorado County Office of Education as an official planning participant; and

WHEREAS, an approved and adopted Hazard Mitigation Plan is required for the El Dorado County Office of Education to continue to receive federal disaster mitigation funds and remain eligible for project grants under FEMA's Hazard Assistance program; and,

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2019, FEMA approved the El Dorado County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan that is valid for five years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the El Dorado County Board of Education authorizes and supports El Dorado County Office of Education to continue to participate with other El Dorado County public agencies to update the Local Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan which fully meets all State and FEMA grant eligibility requirements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the El Dorado County Office of Education Superintendent and the Superintendent's designee(s) are hereby directed and authorized to take any and all action reasonable and necessary to implement this Resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as a local agency partner participant and fair share recipient of federal mitigation planning funding, the El Dorado County Office of Education fully supports the El Dorado County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, adopted by FEMA on April 26, 2019 and approves and adopts Annex "E" (attached as Attachment 1) for submission for the El Dorado County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
