Sixth grade will be working on Negative and Mixed Numbers ad coefficients There will be a review for a test on Tuesday. I recommend all students who would like help to prepare for the test, to come to math lab this week. This test covers Common Core 6NS2, 6F3 and 6G2.

7th Grade:

Seventh grade will begin lesson 104 on compound average and rate. There will be a test on Wednesday. This assessment will cover Common Core 7F3 and 7G1,2.
