EXTENDED DAY

Extended Day was developed in response to working parents' need for quality child care. Located on school campuses throughout El Dorado County, Extended Day provides child care before, during, and after school, as well as during school vacations or intersession times. The programs allow children to go back and forth from school to child care without parent transportation. Children participate in a variety of educationally enriched activities in a safe, well-supervised environment. Full-day kindergarten programs are offered at some schools.

Charter Home Study Academy K - 8

(530) 622-6984

This successful home school program is available for children in kindergarten through 8th grade. Students and their parents meet individually with a fully credentialed, highly qualified teacher on a regular basis. Parents are responsible for lesson planning, monitoring educational activities, and correcting student work while teachers review lesson plans, provide resources and support, and assess academic progress. Classes in core academic subjects, such as math and science, are offered to students.

Charter Connections Academy 9 - 12

Charter Connections Academy provides students in grades 9 -12 with individual, small class, and interactive online learning options, including credit recovery/acceleration, to meet state standards and earn a high school diploma in a nurturing, responsive environment. Our friendly, professional staff

Charter University Prep

Students in grades 7-12 are provided with a university preparatory program that emphasizes fine arts curricula. Students enroll in on-site core courses that meet twice weekly and complete the remainder of their schedule through independent study. This program requires a high level of student responsibility. Students are placed in courses according to their demonstrated learning level. Instruction is provided by fully credentialed, highly qualified teachers.



El Dorado Trade School

El Dorado Trade School provides 7-12th grade students with the vocational, academic, and social skills necessary to seamlessly transition to a successful career or to a post high school education or training opportunity. State subject area standards are integrated with vocational and life skills to make learning relevant, applicable, and enjoyable. We provide learning experiences that help prepare students for the real world of employment through hands-on projects and the development of student leadership. To ensure student success, multiple levels of support are provided, including targeted academic remediation, credit recovery/acceleration, individualized education plans, and career counseling.

Community School 7-12

Our Community School Program serves at-risk students in grades 7-12. Students attend a full day academic program geared for successfully earning a middle or high school diploma. The program offers advanced instructional technology, including opportunities for online learning, targeted academic remediation, and credit recovery/acceleration. The program provides effective instruction, ongoing communication with parents, and enhanced support and supervision. Our goal is to provide a successful education for those experiencing behavioral, attendance, or academic roadblocks.

The Campus and El Dorado Trade School programs provide a unique *Work Ready Certificate Program* which emphasizes career readiness. Students participate in a variety of activities in preparation for becoming employed or attending a community college program.

Early Head Start

Early Head Start is offered to pregnant and/or parenting teens and provides parenting information and community resources. An Early Head Start center is available to high school students who need child care while they finish their high school education.

CARE Program

(530) 295-2259

The CARE Program (Community Action for Responsive Education) provides an individualized educational and behavioral program for students needing additional support to be successful. For participating districts, a specialized classroom program is provided at the student's local school. Students are referred by their local school or their parents. A CARE team develops strategies to assist

students in becoming academically, behaviorally, and socially successful.

Community School K-6

(530) 295-2259

Community School serves students in grades K-6 who are experiencing difficulty meeting behavioral, social, and academic standards. Curriculum is centered on the Common Core State Standards while taking into account individual needs and learning styles. A lower student-to-teacher ratio is provided. The program focuses on building upon student assets and strengths while providing targeted academic remediation. We help students successfully transition back to their school of origin with the skills necessary to succeed.
