

CUPrep/CCA – General Dress Code Guidelines:

1. The Board expects that students will present themselves in an orderly manner conducive to the advancement of education. Student appearance should be neat and acceptable.
2. Students should wear clothes suitable, and in an appropriate manner, for school activities. Students' clothing, accessories, and personal items must not present a health or safety hazard or a distraction which interferes with the educational process.
3. Clothing, accessories, and personal items shall be free of writing, pictures, insignias, or markings which would be considered, by reasonable standards, to be vulgar, profane, or sexually suggestive; which display or promote drug, alcohol, or tobacco use; which advocate gang, racial, ethnic, or religious prejudice, or which would promote or incite unlawful or inappropriate conduct.
4. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments (bras and underwear) at all times. See-through or fish-net fabrics, halter tops, off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops, bare midriffs, and skirts or shorts shorter than mid-thigh are prohibited.
5. For safety reasons, shoes must be worn at all times; slippers are not allowed. Individual courses may require specific types of safety equipment.
6. Gang- related clothing is prohibited. Because gang-related symbols are constantly changing, definitions of gang-related apparel or symbols shall be reviewed and enforced throughout the year as related information is received.
7. Clothing, accessories, and personal items must be safe. Items such as, but not limited to, chains, or spiked belts, or jewelry are not allowed. Inappropriate tattoos and/or body drawings must be covered.

The school administrator will make individual determination if clothing (or lack of) is acceptable.
