W HAT A WONDERFUL YEAR 2013 HAS BEEN!

We have so much to be grateful for and so many people, businesses and organizations to thank for their support. The annual report highlights our 2013 achievements and acknowledges supporters of our school. The report also serves as our winter edition of In Touch.

As I reflect on 2013, I am filled with gratitude. Due to the tremendous outpouring of commitment and support from current parents, alumni, alumni parents, grandparents, parishioners and friends, we are well positioned for success. We have also been busy cleaning out and cleaning up, renovating, and preparing our facilities for the future. We even cleaned out and updated my office! Please stop by and say hello if you are in the area.

Our growing student body and facility needs have been an ongoing challenge as we try to keep our aging school in top shape for generations to come and find enough space to accommodate our dynamic needs. Our school was built in 1932 and is starting to show its age. Earlier in 2013, we decided it was time to upgrade Cavanagh Hall, also known as the gym or Large Hall, and began a campaign to raise \$150,000 to make improvements. Some of these will be carried out over the summer of 2014 in time for the 2014-15 school year. For those that do not know the history of this hall or how it got its often misspelled name, or if you are simply in need of a trip down memory lane, we hope enjoy the article on page 16. Be sure to join us in fall 2014 for a reception celebrating the improvements to this important part of Mount Carmel's history.

We have, by so many accounts, exceeded my expectations in 2013. Some of our accomplishments include:

- Receiving another six-year term of accreditation, the highest given by WCEA/WASC.
- Successfully adopting and incorporating Common Core math curriculum, grades TK-8.
- Participating in the Archdiocesan Academic Decathlon in March, in which two students took first place in individual events: religion and fine arts.
- Graduating the 129th class at Our Lady of Mount Carmel School in May 2013.
- Exceeding budgeted amounts for all fundraisers.
- Raising nearly \$40,000 as of 12/31/2013 for the 2013-14 Annual Campaign. The Annual Campaign starts in November each year. This year focused on three priorities: Adopt-a-Student Tuition Assistance Fund, the Endowment Fund, and the Cavanagh Hall/Gym Renovation Fund.
- Generating over \$90,000 toward our \$150,000 goal for Cavanagh Hall.
- Achieving a record number of sponsors and advertisers for our Festival (34) and Auction (38) and over 300 donors of items and/or services.
- Learning that two graduates from the class of 2009 were selected as high school valedictorians.
- Establishing a very successful and robust Transitional Kindergarten program, one of three in the Archdiocese.
- Acquiring a total of 65 iPads, Chromebooks, Macbook Pros and laptops for student and faculty use.

As you look through these pages, you will see many names repeated. The support of the families, businesses and individuals reflected in the following pages makes the work of our faculty and students possible.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel receives donations to the following funds:

- **Adopt-a-Student** – Our tuition assistance fund that helps fund tuition for students who would not otherwise be able to attend Our Lady of Mount Carmel School.
- **Adopt-a-Student Honoraria and Memorial Gifts** – Gifts to the Adopt-a-Student fund made in memory of a person who has passed away or honors a living person.
- **Adopt-a-Student Parish Offertory Support** – Gifts made through the generosity of parishioners during a second collection at Mass once a month.
- **Cavanagh Hall/Gym Renovation** – A fund established in 2013 to fund upgrades to the facility that will take place starting in summer 2014.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel School Scrip Program is one of the largest fundraising activities for the school. The program is designed so that a percentage of a family's everyday purchases can turn into cash contributions for the school. The most uniquely structured and successful in the Archdiocese, our program, run by Mary McLinden, is based on profit generated for the school and is budgeted to provide the school with approximately \$45,000 annually.

The school purchases gift certificates and gift cards at a discounted price, and the school earns the difference between the face value (your purchase price) and the negotiated price. Each family is asked to generate \$240 in net profit to the school each year. Any family exceeding that amount shares the additional profit generated with the school. Families can choose to donate their portion back to the school or use it as credit towards tuition.

Father John P. Cavanagh and Father John P. Kavanaugh

Part of Our Lady of Mount Carmel's history since 1927

Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish has had two pastors with very similar names. The two are often confused and the names misspelled, so we thought it would be helpful to provide some history. John Patrick Cavanagh was pastor from 1927 to 1961 and John Paul Kavanaugh was pastor from 1988 to 1997. The Large Hall is named after Father John Patrick Cavanagh.



John Patrick Cavanagh was born in San Francisco on July 23, 1886. He graduated from Old St. Brendan's parish school in 1901. After

seminary studies at Saint Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, Father Cavanagh was ordained on June 22, 1912 in Saint Mary's Cathedral by Archbishop Patrick W. Riordan. Father Cavanagh served at St. Charles in San Carlos from 1912-1915, St. Matthew in San Mateo from 1915-1918 as a chaplain in the U.S. Army from 1918-1919, at Sacred Heart in San Francisco from 1919-1922, and at St. Brigid in San Francisco from 1922-1923. In 1923 he became Pastor of St. Aloysius in Palo Alto and Our Lady of the Wayside in Portola Valley. Then, in 1927, he was the sixth pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church and served here for 34 years until 1961 when he died in the rectory that he built. He is buried in the Cavanagh family plot at Holy Cross Cemetery in Colma.

The entire complex of the present Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish was constructed under Father Cavanagh's direction, including the school, which cost \$100,000 and was completed in 1932. The school auditorium, known as Cavanagh Hall,

served as the church until Christmas 1951. After Father Cavanagh's passing, the retired Rev. Joseph D. Munier became pastor until he was elevated to rank of Monsignor by Archbishop Joseph T. McGucken in 1962.

Under the pastoral leadership of Father Ulysses d'Aquila, the school and church are updating Cavanagh Hall so that it can serve many generations to come. The project is scheduled for completion during the summer of 2014.

Father John Paul Kavanaugh, who passed away in June 2013, served as Pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel

from 1988 to 1997 and taught at Serra High School. Father Kavanaugh hired Principal Teresa Anthony in 1990. Father Jack attended St. Joseph's College

and St. Patrick's Seminary. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of San Francisco on December 18, 1948. He served as associate pastor at St. Monica, St. Bruno, St. Raphael, St. James, and St. Frances Cabrini, pastor of St. Matthias, St. Finn Barr, and Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Jack also taught at Serra High School. Fr. Jack was invested as a Magistral Chaplain in the Order of St. John of Jerusalem of Rhodes and Malta (Order of Malta). He received the Cross pro piis meritis pro Merito Melitense from the Grand Master of the Order of Malta, for his many services as a Chaplain of the Order. In 2001, he moved to Serra Clergy House in San Mateo, where he happily resided until his death.

Alumni Spotlight: Our School Mission in Action

Jim Hartnett '64

Our Lady of Mount Carmel School’s mission is to develop students with creative minds, a sense of purpose, compassion for others and the courage to act on their Catholic beliefs.

Jim attended Our Lady of Mount Carmel from 1957 to 1964. His mother, uncle, aunt, sister, brother and many Royer and Hartnett cousins also attended Our Lady of Mount Carmel School and Jim’s uncle, Bill Royer '34, went on to become mayor of Redwood City, a San Mateo County Supervisor and a member of the United States Congress.

After Our Lady of Mount Carmel School, Jim attended Sequoia High School, Cañada College, Sophia University’s International Division in Tokyo, Japan, and Santa Clara University where he received a Juris Doctorate. Jim also served in the U. S. Navy (Reserves), Naval Security Group, including active duty from 1970-72 in Florida and Japan. He has been an attorney since 1978 and a partner in Hartnett Smith and Paetkau since 1995, focusing on business and real estate law, dispute resolution and litigation.

Demonstrating his dedication to Redwood City and a true sense of purpose, Jim served for four terms on Redwood City’s City Council from 1993 to 2009 and served as mayor for one term. His interest in community involvement started in high school when he was President of the Mount Carmel Teen Club. When he returned to Redwood City, Jim was appointed to the 1984 Charter Review Committee by Mayor Brent Britschgi, (OLMC Class of '49). The Planning Commission then appointed him to the Redwood City Housing and Human Concerns Committee, where he served for eight years. He also served on the Planning Commission for one year before being elected to City Council in 1993. He has served on numerous business and non-profit boards, including two terms as Chair of the Board of the Redwood City-San Mateo Chamber of Commerce, and has been dedicated to youth sports, serving as baseball manager and coach.

Jim’s desire to serve others has strong Mount Carmel roots. He has two uncles who have been mayor of Redwood City, Jack Greenalch and Bill Royer, and his parents were active parishioners:

While Jim has retired from elected office, he is still active in government and was appointed by the President of the California State Senate to serve on the California High Speed Rail Board in 2005 where he currently serves as Vice Chair. ***In Touch:* What was the hardest decision you had to make as a council member?**

Jim: Making the right decision is not hard. I believe in deciding and moving on. There were many controversial decisions. One of the most controversial was the recycled water project/system which I worked on extensively. It set the stage for 100 years of progress.

***In Touch:* What are your thoughts on all of the development that has occurred downtown and where Redwood City is headed?**

Jim: Deadwood City is buried. Long live Redwood City!

***In Touch:* You give back to your community in so many ways. What are a few of your favorite organizations and fundraisers?**

Jim: I admire greatly all the church, sports, service clubs and community volunteers. The most fun I had was when I was a coach of soccer and baseball. The most meaningful recognition I received was years ago by the Redwood City National Little League. I was proud to have restarted Redwood City Big League for 16- to 18-year-olds, in which I sponsored and managed teams.

Jim: Redwood City is the beneficiary of decades of commitment of many councils and community volunteers. I am proud to be part of setting the foundation for the future.
